

Following an Open Village Meeting attended by 148 people the Mind the Green Gap campaign was formed to stop the New Road development, and others that are connected with it. The campaign believes the villages around Didcot should not become suburbs and is worried about road safety, school capacity, and the loss of grade 1 arable land that is a rural amenity to both the village and Didcot. This plan is not consistent with the SODC's published planning strategy and should be stopped.
