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VEGETATION AND FOOTPATHS



It's that time of year again - the village is lush and green after the recent sunshine and showers. While the village certainly benefits from the variety of seasonal growth, it is also important to be mindful that overhanging hedges, trees and other plants can create real problems for the users of pavements and footpaths. The village has a number of narrow and raised footpaths and safe access and visibility when using these paths is of key importance.

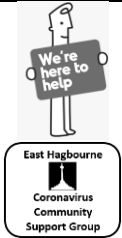
Mobility scooters, wheelchairs and pushchairs are particularly affected so please ensure you trim any vegetation on your property boundaries regularly, particularly if it is alongside a public footpath.

The owner or occupier of a property has a legal responsibility (Highway Act 1980 s154) to ensure that the 'public highway' adjacent to a property is not obstructed by vegetation from their property. Thank you in advance for keeping the village both beautiful and safely accessible to as many people as possible.
