

Rector's Reflections Lighting a Candle of Hope

I wonder if you are a fan of the longer Winter nights? Many people find them quite a challenge. In the northern hemisphere we have reached the Winter Solstice – the 24 hour period with the fewest hours of daylight. The good news is that from then on, the hours of daylight gradually get longer and longer. It can be hard to believe this on a cold evening in January, but by the beginning of February I think most of us feel that the days really are lengthening and that Spring can't be far behind.

The long Winter evenings remind us of the importance of light, and it is not surprising that festivals of light were held at this time of year. Light was particularly important in the days before artificial light was readily and cheaply available. Can you imagine what the winter must have been like if you were dependent on a candle or two, occasionally supplemented by the light coming from a fire in the hearth?

I think every culture would understand the symbolism of a light shining in the darkness: it is a universal image, speaking of hope and security. The imagery of light is found throughout the Bible. A passage from an Old Testament prophet called Isaiah reads as follows: "Arise, shine, for your light has come, and the glory of the Lord has risen among you. For darkness shall cover the earth, and thick darkness the peoples; but the Lord will shine upon you, and his glory will appear over you. Nations shall come to your light, and kings to the brightness of your dawn." In the New Testament, the imagery of light is often applied to Jesus, who is called the Light of the World.

Whatever your religious beliefs, I think that there can be something really helpful and hopeful in the simple act of lighting a candle and remembering loved ones. Churches often have candles available precisely for this purpose, and locally there are racks of such candles in Hagbourne and Blewbury churches. Do pop in and light a candle. As a Christian, I believe that a lighted candle can still speak powerfully of importance of hope. There is always hope, and sometimes we need to remind ourselves of this, especially when the world around us seems a dark and unwelcoming place. Father Jason.

Christingle Service at St Andrew's Sunday, 21st January at 10.30am

The word 'Christingle' actually means 'Christ Light' and celebrates the light of Jesus coming into the world. The orange is round, like the world; the candle gives us light in the dark, like the love of God; the red ribbon goes round the 'world', as a symbol of Christ's blood, given for everyone; the four sticks point in all directions, and symbolise that God is over all: North, South, East and West; and the fruit and nuts remind us of God's blessings. We will assemble our Christingles in the Service.

The Children's Society first introduced the Christingle Service to The Church of England in 1968, and it has since become a popular event in the church calendar. This candlelit celebration is an ideal way to share the key messages of the Christian faith, while helping to raise vital funds to help vulnerable children across the country. 



WHERE HAVE ALL THE BIRDS GONE? THE SHOCKING DECLINE OF BRITISH WILD BIRDS and how we can help them fight back in 2024.

Britain has lost almost a third of all its wild birds, down by 73 million since 1970. Declines in favourite garden birds include the song thrush, skylark, lapwing, and house sparrow, according to the 2023 report from the British Trust for Ornithology (BTO) and the RSPB (*). A shocking 30 million house sparrows, 20 million starlings, 4 million skylarks, 2 million blackbirds and 1 million chaffinches have gone from British skies. The most serious decline is among farmland birds. The 63% fall in their numbers is linked by the report primarily to agricultural intensification as well as climate change and habitat loss. But it is not all pure gloom - conservation actions have helped to drive the recovery of some of the UK's birds, and this work can help address some of the drivers of wildlife decline. How we can help ...

In winter:

- Birds need **high-energy, high-fat foods** during cold weather. Many birds, especially small ones, die of starvation in long periods of low temperatures.
- Keep **bird feeders topped up with good quality bird foods**, especially when natural food is in short supply from October to April.
- Measure the difference and help record how garden birds are doing in the RSPB Big Bird Count: 26-28th January. Half a million people joined the Big Garden Birdwatch in 2023 and counted 9.1 million birds!. Please take part!

In summer:

- Low ground cover planting, flowering plants and shrubs, areas of uncut grass and wildflowers, climbers, bushes and trees all provide shelter and nesting sites for birds and mammals. Remember that baby chick survival depends on food availability in May and June.
- **Provide clean water** for drinking and bathing a pond or just a large bowl remember there is no moisture in many birds' natural food or in seed mixes.

In the fields: Farming accounts for 69% of land in England. Agricultural intensification, destruction of habitats to make larger fields, loss of hedgerows, use of pesticides and herbicides, shifts to lower plant diversity - have all played a role in bird decline. The way farmers produce food is key to helping nature recover - and they need increased funding and incentives to help them. The UK government has committed to take urgent action to restore nature and halt wildlife decline – it needs to be held to its commitments.

"Everyone should be concerned that UK bird populations are continuing to decline... this is a crucial indicator of the condition of our environment and health of our natural world."

Obituary - Brenda Clare 12th June 1929 – 4th September 2023

It's with great sadness that I write to let you know that former much loved East Hagbourne resident Brenda Clare sadly passed away in September this year, aged 94, following a short illness.

Brenda moved to East Hagbourne in 1957 following her marriage to Arnold who commenced his career as a Nuclear Physicist at Harwell Atomic Research Centre. They resided at Sundial Cottage, Main Road and were well known residents of the village, where they had made many friends. They would often be seen driving around the village in their vintage open top MG sports car or walking their beloved Labrador dog, Cider.



Sadly, Arnold passed away suddenly in 1979. Brenda continued to live in the village and was supported by her many friends and neighbours and also Margaret, her lifelong friend from Liverpool College of Art. Brenda kept herself busy with village life and together with her friend Monica Lawson organised many events and activities in the village over the years, including village fetes and events. With her love of amateur dramatics, she also wrote, produced and performed in a number of amateur plays, musicals and variety performances, with Margaret assisting with costumes, raising money for Cancer Research. Brenda was also involved in a lot of voluntary work and once won an award for best window display at the Cancer Research shop in Didcot where she regularly volunteered. She arranged a new window display every Sunday and locals would comment that it looked more like a fashion shop than a charity shop. Brenda was also a school governor and used to visit the local primary school where the children would look forward to her reading to them. In 1995 East Hagbourne Parish Council published "East Hagbourne Times" a history of the village compiled by Brenda and her friends and neighbours Monica Lawson and Willie Pereira.

Brenda had a love of reading and was also a keen artist and poet, having attended Liverpool College of Art in the 1950's, and later became a fashion designer. She painted many abstract paintings which she proudly displayed in her apartment. Brenda also volunteered to read every week to a blind clergyman, Canon Edgar Walmsley who encouraged her to start writing poetry which she began writing on scraps of paper, often using her own life experiences or observations on local village life in East Hagbourne as inspiration. Some of her poems were published in local newspapers and magazines. Much later, in 2015, Brenda achieved her lifetime ambition of publishing them as a complete collection in her book "I was Just Thinking... A collection of Poems by Brenda Clare" which raised over £1,000 for Cancer Research. Brenda went on to record her poems, read by herself, on to CD which raised over £500 for the RNIB.

In 2000, Brenda who had recently turned 70, decided it was time to move back to Lancashire to live nearer her lifelong friend from Art College, Margaret. Brenda moved to an apartment at Rufford New Hall in Rufford, Lancashire, a former stately home, where she made many new friends and helped redesign the formal walled gardens on the estate which had once belonged to the Hesketh family. Brenda never forget her many friends and neighbours from East Hagbourne, who she spoke fondly of and regularly kept in touch with many of them over the years but sadly many have since passed away. She often recalled stories of the many happy times she had spent in East Hagbourne over the years, including organising events, the filming of Dr Who and once appearing with her dog Cider on a jigsaw picture of the village, to mention a few.

Brenda continued to have good health in later life and had an active lifestyle with her daily walks, short breaks to the lake district, she was still driving at 90 and up until lockdown attended weekly pilates classes. Brenda who is sadly missed by all who knew her, is survived by her lifelong friend from Art College, Margaret Barlow. Brenda's Service for the Celebration of her Life took place on 29th September at the West Lancashire Crematorium.

Comments from the East Hagbourne Parish Council Chairman A Very Happy New Year to one and all

Fix My Street It is good to start with something that is more positive than it often gets credit for. This is the County Council mechanism for reporting issues with highways, footways, channels (the edge of the road bordering the footway or verge) and some footpaths. It is called Fix My Street and is referenced in every Parish Council page in this magazine, viz https://www.fixmystreet.com/ I really do encourage you to report any issues through this means. This includes potholes, non-functioning street lights, fly tipping, blocked drains, and obstructions on footpaths. The site is monitored on a daily basis and, after checking whether the request is appropriate and is not already being actioned (a response will be sent if this is the case), a team from OCC will visit the site within a couple of days to assess what action is needed. Many of our village footpaths are not covered by Fix My Street so, if the issue concerns them, the appropriate web site is https://publicrightsofway.oxfordshire.gov.uk/standardmap.aspx On potholes, action should be taken soon if the hole is 40mm or more deep on a road, or 20mm or more deep on a footway but otherwise nothing will normally happen except for a notification to this effect on the web page. Fix My Street really does work and I recommend that people use this as soon as they notice something is amiss. I appreciate that not everybody is web savvy although the interface is quite accessible. If this is still daunting then hopefully a friend could help, with a default friend of our Parish Clerk!

Joint Local Plan We are in South Oxfordshire and our district councillors represent us for South Oxfordshire (SODC). However, for some time, the people working for the district are recorded as being for South and Vale, which includes the neighbouring district of Vale of the White Horse (VWHDC). For the first time we will have a local plan covering both SODC and VWHDC and the Preferred Options for this plan will be open for comment in January for responses by 21st February. An important aspect of this joint local plan in the Didcot area is that much of the new building within Harwell Parish (Valley Park for example) is in VWHDC whereas Didcot is in SODC. Although the Parish Council will scrutinise this plan carefully to see how this might affect our village and will submit comments on it, comments are welcome and encouraged from everyone. The claim is that the interactive web site will be very user friendly.

Annual Parish Meeting The Annual Parish Meeting will be held in Hagbourne Village Hall on Thursday 28th March. Please "Save the Date" as the main agenda item will be a discussion of how best to spend the significant sums of money from the Deanfield development for the betterment of our village.

Housing development by the Village Hall As you might have seen, the access from the site onto the railway embankment is still not open. This is because of safety concerns. The site manager has this as a priority and hopefully access will be available in the near future. There are now 14 homes occupied with a very varied and interesting range of residents. So far, there are only two school age children so the pressure for places at our primary school is not yet as severe as we might have thought although it is still early days.

Parish Surgeries I will recommence the Parish Surgeries in the Fleur starting on Friday 12th January from 5.00 to 6.30 pm. You can still call in even if you are having a dry January. However, feel free to contact me (iain.duff@easthagbourne.net), the clerk or any other councillor should you have urgent concerns.

Parish Council meetings Parish Council meetings are held in the Pavilion on the Recreation Ground. Members of the public are welcome to join the meeting and the agenda is posted on village notice boards and the village web pages at least three clear days before the meeting. The next meeting will be held starting at 7.30pm on Thursday 11th January. Let me remind you that this is not a formal or even approved article from the Parish Council but is rather a few words from me.
